When Duty Calls

It happens differently for everyone. Some know months or even a year before that it is going to happen. Some have less than a few weeks and still others find out and then "Poof!," their spouse is gone.

Vicki's husband shipped out with his whole company amid fanfare and balloons. They knew he was going for almost six months. The green bags loomed in their garage while he slowly and methodically prepared to step out of their family for five months.

For Jennifer, the green bags are always packed. It is Rob's job to be always ready and able to deploy. Most of the time she only has one day of notice, and he can't tell where he is going or when he will get back.

John broke it to me gently over the phone. I have been married to a military man for almost ten years so I know the drill by now. After all, deployment is always a possibility. He said he would be leaving in about two weeks, but that he didn't know for sure when. The next 16 days were a whirlwind of getting things in order and trying to savor every last moment together. Before I knew it I was standing in the airport watching him walk through security and out of sight, crying harder than I ever thought I could.

We are a country at war. Although this war doesn't affect most American's daily lives, for the 2.7 million active duty military, National Guard, and reservist and their families, it means that at some point our families will be separated.

According to Tech Sergeant Pamela King-Hasberry, the director of Eglin Air Force Base's Hearts' Apart Program, the biggest challenge for military spouses during a deployment is the prospect being a single parent and having all of the household responsibility. Shouldering all of the weight of running a family and home while living with worry and uncertainty about the safety and well-being of your soldier or airman can be a lot the take.

King-Hasberry suggests that the at-home parent take care of themselves first. Take steps to get enough rest and good nutrition to stay healthy. When the spouse at home is healthy and mentally strong, she can more easily handle the added stress of single parenting. King-Hasberry says that the spouse at home must be proactive, get involved and take care of themself to ensure a relatively successful separation.

Take breaks from the kids when possible to recharge your batteries. The Hearts' Apart Program offers free childcare for deployed families through their "Give Parents a Break" program.

Hearts' Apart also offers a free meal in the dining hall to deployed families as an additional opportunity for the left behind spouse to take a break.

Staying in touch with your service member is very important. Hearts' Apart offers four 15 minute-morale calls a week. The Hearts' Apart program can arrange for video conferences if the military member's location can support the call. In addition, keeping in contact via email can make the distance seem shorter for families. Most important families need to stay in touch so that when the service member comes home, strong family bonds have been maintained.

The bottom line is is hard. Can you survive it? you can. Will it always like that? Not always. I had that I was sure I was going to in half from the pressure, two kids in baseball, a puppy to train, classes for my master's degree-I just knew I was going to snap. That is when all I could do was take one step at a time and worry only about what was immediately in front of me. You have to ask for help and you have to let go of whatever you can. But you can and will make it.

The nice thing about deployments is that eventually you can get into a routine so that the day to day doesn't seem so hard. Trust your instincts and let things go if they are not important to your daily survival or sanity.

An example in my life: I decided against putting away the laundry. It is John's job when he is home and I frankly hate it, plus when I would do it, it made me cry because I would think, "he should be here with me doing this- not in a tent somewhere." Besides it was just me and the boys so we weren't using the dining room, "therefore, that is where the laundry came to live. I know it sounds so strange but it made my life much easier and thereby less stressful and isn't that the point?

Get by any way you can and eventually your hero will come home. You both will be surprised to learn that indeed there are two heroes in the family. The one who goes and fights the war and the one who makes sure he has a warm and happy home to come back to. I salute you both.

Tips from the Trenches:

Before your spouse leaves, make time for just the two of you. With kids, extended family and community members sending him off, sometimes the husband or wife can get lost in the shuffle.

Keep yourself busy. Have dates planned on your calendar for the duration of the deployment so you can mark the time until the reunion.

Make a paper chain for the kids to mark the days. Tear of one link everyday until Mommy or Daddy comes home. You can add or subtract links as the return date changes.

Ask people for help and tell them how they can help you. Friends and neighbors usually want to help military families but don't know what you need. A simple request with a big thank you goes a long way.

Get in contact with other separated families. It really helps to have someone who is going through the same thing to lean on, not to mention having another adult to spend the weekend days with when everyone else is with their family.

Cut your kids a little slack. They are going through a lot too. My eight year old started waking up at night. Normally I would never let him sleep with me, but he was missing his dad too.

Keep your expectations for the reunion in check. It is going to be a little strange having your spouse back in your life again. Don't set yourself up for disappointment by building up the reunion to be a "second honeymoon."

BALLET CONSERVATORY





REASONS


How important are healthy teeth and a beautiful smile? Consider this: babies smile as early as three weeks old. By the time a child is 18 months old, he or she smiles once every six minutes and by age four, the rate increases to one smile every minute. That's a lot of smiling! A beautiful smile obviously plays a large part in physical attractiveness.

Why do you think cosmetic dentistry is one of the common fixes in reality makeover shows like The Swan infection. Researchers have shown a and Extreme Makeover? When you watch TV, flip through a magazine, or see a billboard, how often do you see advertisers placing models in ads with discolored, crooked teeth and unpleasant smiles? Not often. A healthy smile not only influences what we think and how we feel about others, but what we think and how we feel about ourselves. A beautiful smile leads to higher self-confidence and self-eteem, makes individuals appear more friendly and cooperative, gives people the ability to influence people, and has pleasureproducing control for both the giver and receiver. With so much evidence of the power of a smile, it's no surprise that marketing experts rely on those people with healthy teeth and nice grins to sell their products.

Besides influencing physical attractiveness, healthy teeth are vital in helping children learn how to speak properly. When we speak, we must coordinate many muscles from various body parts and systems, including the vocal cords, teeth, lips, tongue, mouth and the respiratory system. Our teeth help us speak clearly

and distinctly. Healthy teeth are also important in proper feeding and nutrition. Cavities (holes in the protective layers of a tooth) can cause pain and can lead to

possible link between the number of cavities a child has and the chance of the child being underweight. It makes sense that if it hurts for a kid to chew his or her food, they are less likely to want to eat, thus becoming underweight! The enamel (the protective layer) of a tooth) on baby teeth is immature and porous. It takes seven years for the porous, chalky enamel to be replaced by more mature, dense, hard, shiny enamel making children more prone to cavities than



adults.

TEETH FOR LIFE

Some people assume they will lose their teeth as they age, but that doesn't have to happen. With the advancement of medical and dental technology, fluorinated water, toothpastes, and mouthwashes, as well as, having dental information at our fingertips, our teeth and our children's teeth should last a lifetime. Here are some tips for keeping your Kidz on the Coast smiles healthy and beautiful:

- Wipe newborn's gums with a clean, damp cloth after each feeding to prevent plaque (harmful bacteria) buildup.
- Never put children to bed with a bottle of any thing (milk or juice) except water to prevent bottle tooth decay.
- Begin brushing infant's teeth as soon as they come in using a pea-sized amount of fluoride toothpaste.
- Parents should continue to help children brush their teeth until they are seven to eight years old.
- Children should visit the dentist before their first birthday (or earlier if problems are noticed).
- Dental check-ups and cleanings should be scheduled every 6 months.
- Children six months to 16 years old should drink fluorinated water (Well water and bottled spring water do not have fluoride).
- Everyone should brush twice a day and floss once daily to remove bacteria.
- Children (and adults) involved in sports should wear the proper mouth protection to prevent teeth getting knocked out and mouth injuries.
- If a permanent tooth is knocked out of a child's (or adult's) mouth, gently rinse (do not scrub) the tooth off and place it in a cup of warm milk (saltwater is the second best and plain water is the third best choice), call the dentist and take the individual and the soaking tooth in immediately for reimplanting.

FUN FACTS: Commercial dental floss was first manufactured in 1882 and it was made of silk. In 1994, a prison inmate in West Virginia braided floss into a rope, scaled the prison walls and escaped!

SEALANTS AND SNACKS

Dental sealants are another excellent way to prevent tooth decay in back teeth. The back teeth, or molars, are where chewing takes place and are filled with tiny hills and valleys called pits and fissures. It is difficult for tooth-brushes and floss to get to the places where plaque can build up. A special varnish called a pit and fissure sealant can prevent cavities from developing in the pit and fissures by sealing off the molars. This dental sealant procedure

takes only minutes, is painless, and is less than half the cost of filling a tooth with a cavity. Also, it is virtually 100 percent effective at stopping tooth decay!

As mentioned earlier, healthy teeth lead to healthy eating habits and healthy eating habits lead to healthy teeth. Keeping your teeth in good shape and your smile bright is greatly influenced by what you and your children eat. Although sugary snacks may taste good, they are not so good for your teeth or body. When sugar gets into your mouth, the bacteria in plaque turns the sweet stuff into acids and these acids are strong enough to dissolve the hard enamel that covers your teeth. It's simple, if you don?t eat much sugar, the bacteria can't produce much acid. When you're deciding on a snack, think about the number of times a day you eat sugary snacks, how long the sugary food stays in your mouth (while you're eating it and afterwards), and the texture of the sugary food (Is it chewy and sticking to your teeth for a long time?). Here are some tips to help you snack smart:

- Pick a variety of foods to snack on; fresh fruits, raw vegetables, grains, milk and dairy products, nuts and seeds.
- Choose sugary foods less often.
- Avoid sweets between meals.
- Brush your teeth with fluoride toothpaste after snacks and meals (or rinse your mouth out with water if brushing is not possible).



right into the open mouth of crocodiles and picks out the food from between the crocodiles? teeth! Dogs have 42 teeth, cats have 30 teeth, pigs have 44 teeth, and adult humans have 32!

BOTTOM LINE ON BRACES

Having straight teeth is important, not only for aesthetic reasons noted earlier, but also because crooked or out of place (misaligned) teeth have unnatural spaces and/or crowding that make them harder to clean and more susceptible to cavities. Dr. Scott Runnels, an orthodontist in Destin, also points out that in some cases, misaligned teeth can affect the way an individual's upper and lower jaw line up causing discomfort. Dr. Runnels explains that orthodontic (the dental specialty of correcting or preventing irregularities of the teeth) treatment works by exerting gentle pressure over time to straighten teeth that are growing, or have already grown, out of place. A visit to Dr. Runnels office reveals that braces have come a long way from the "metal mouth" look of years ago. Now braces are trendy, cool, and more commonplace than ever! Today, orthodontic patients can get transparent brackets (the pieces that attach to the tooth) or use a virtually invisible system (called Invisalign) of removable plastic aligners to straighten teeth. The most important part of any exercise program is choosing a realistic goal and committing to that goal 100%. Whether it's fitting into a certain dress or dropping a certain number of pounds, your goal must be specific to you. Once you choose a goal, write it down three separate times in big bold letters on index cards. Tape one to the refrigerator, another to your computer screen and the last one on your car dash. Seeing your goal daily will help you visualize its success.

Once this step is completed, you can then move onto the business of picking a time each day in which to perform your workout. This time can change from day to day. Just make sure you set the time aside for fitness only. use a virtually invisible system (called Invisalign) of removable plastic aligners to straighten teeth. Of course, the tried and true traditional metal braces are still available and can be jazzed up with colorful bands and accessories transforming the standard into a personal statement!

In the past, parents didn't seek the help of an orthodontist until their kids were teenagers and all their permanent teeth came in, usually crooked and out of place. Now, Dr. Runnels suggests children see an orthodontist at around seven years old. This is a good age to monitor jaw growth and intervene, if necessary. Some children need intervention earlier than others. For example, some kids have eyeteeth (also known as canines) that come in high or their primary teeth (baby teeth) are having a hard time coming out on their own. In cases like this, other dental professionals are conferred with and the problematic teeth can be removed making room for the child's permanent teeth to come in straight. Additionally, kids that suck their thumbs should see an orthodontist, especially if they continue to suck their thumbs past age seven, when their secondary teeth are erupting. Unchecked thumb sucking can potentially cause lasting dental problems. Dr. Runnels reminds us that the effects of thumb sucking are usually reversible, but if not caught and stopped early on, it may lead to buck teeth (where the front teeth are pushed forward causing an open bite) or a lisp (where the teeth are pushed out of their normal position interfering with the proper formation of certain speech sounds).



FUN FACTS: Did you know that the soreness you feel when you burn your mouth on mozzarella cheese from eating a slice of pizza has a name? It's called "pizza palette"!

TO SUM UP A SMILE

The personal, social, and medical benefits of having healthy teeth and a beautiful smile are undeniable. Ideally, all children would have seen a dentist when their first tooth came in, had regular appointments for checkups and cleanings every six months, and have seen an orthodontist by the time they turned seven years old. If you haven?t done this, it's not too late to commit to a daily oral-health routine and regular dental check-ups. Taking care of teeth is a lifelong necessity and starting the habits early will ensure good oral health for years to come.



FUN FACTS: Your teeth are as unique as your fingerprints. Even identical twins have different "dental fingerprints"!
